## THE FLYING EIGHT

The Flying "8" is a variation of The Traveling Four Corners.

Do the Traveling Four Corners up thru count 15.

- 16 Side left, turn 3 walls or 270 degrees left
- 17 Kick right
- 18 Step back right
- 19 Step back left
- 20 Step back right
